QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION FOR ENDING 1

- 1. Why did Matt change his mind and decide to join the group?
- 2. How did dancing together help the children connect with each other?
- 3. What can we learn from Maria's attitude toward her sister?
- 4. How can we make visitors or students from other schools feel welcome in our class?

SUGGESTIO NS FOR ADDITION AL RESOURCE S

- 1. Watch: "Just Because" read aloud a story about acceptance and support.
- 2. Role-play: "What to do when someone is unsure about joining a group?"
- 3. Host an inclusive classroom "Mini Day of Sharing" where students learn about and celebrate each other's strengths.
- 4. Create a "Friendship Recipe" poster with ingredients like patience, listening, and kindness.
- 5. Create a Quizizz quiz with age-appropriate, scenario-based questions to reinforce themes where students will reflect on empathy, support, and inclusion through fun, interactive questions

- 3. Why is it okay to admit when we're wrong and try again?
- 4. What should we do if a classmate feels unsure about someone who is different?
